Our mounted rifles and nurses were highly regarded for their indomitable character and skill. They were tough, they were reliable, and they were brave.

This year we particularly remember the events of May 1900, when after seven long months Australians at home rejoiced with the news of the Relief of Mafeking. It had been a decisive victory and Australians had been right there as the siege was finally brought to an end.

I commend the National Boer War Association for their commitment to honouring the service and sacrifice of Australians in the Boer War. As times passes, it becomes more important that we proudly remember their heroic deeds.
